HUNT FOR RARE BIRD THAT ESCAPED THE LAB

THE OneCamp STEM team based in the Lab in the Special Interest Area Zone have put a call out to the local citizens to help them locate two of their rare birds (Roboticus Droneus) that escaped captivity yesterday afternoon. The pair of birds are endangered and concerns are held for the future of the species if the birds are not found. A STEM spokesperson described the birds as having four disk like wings arranged in a square formation. The

bird is described as having a mechanical appearance and is known to hover and buzz around in the air. The Lab expects the birds may be nesting in nearby trees, or foraging in surrounding grasslands. If you see them please let the Lab know.
