Stay safe and get plenty of sleep.

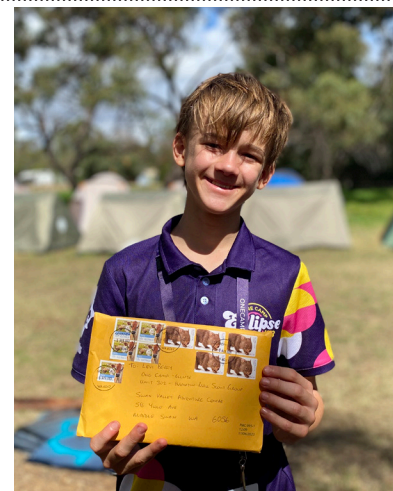


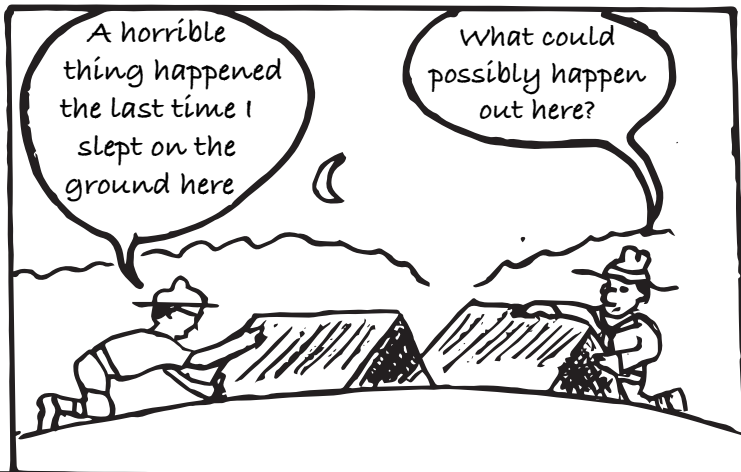
## POST FROM HOME

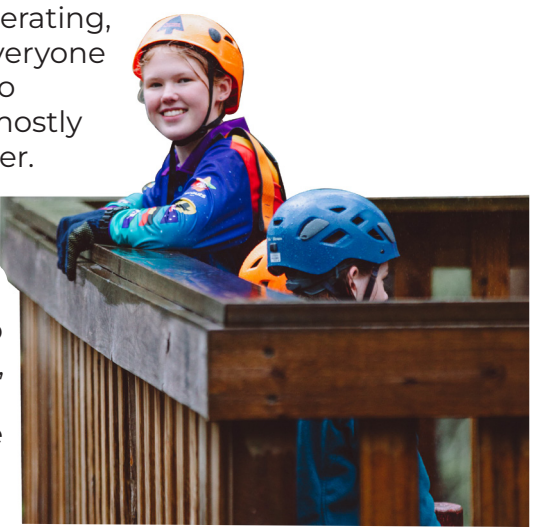
